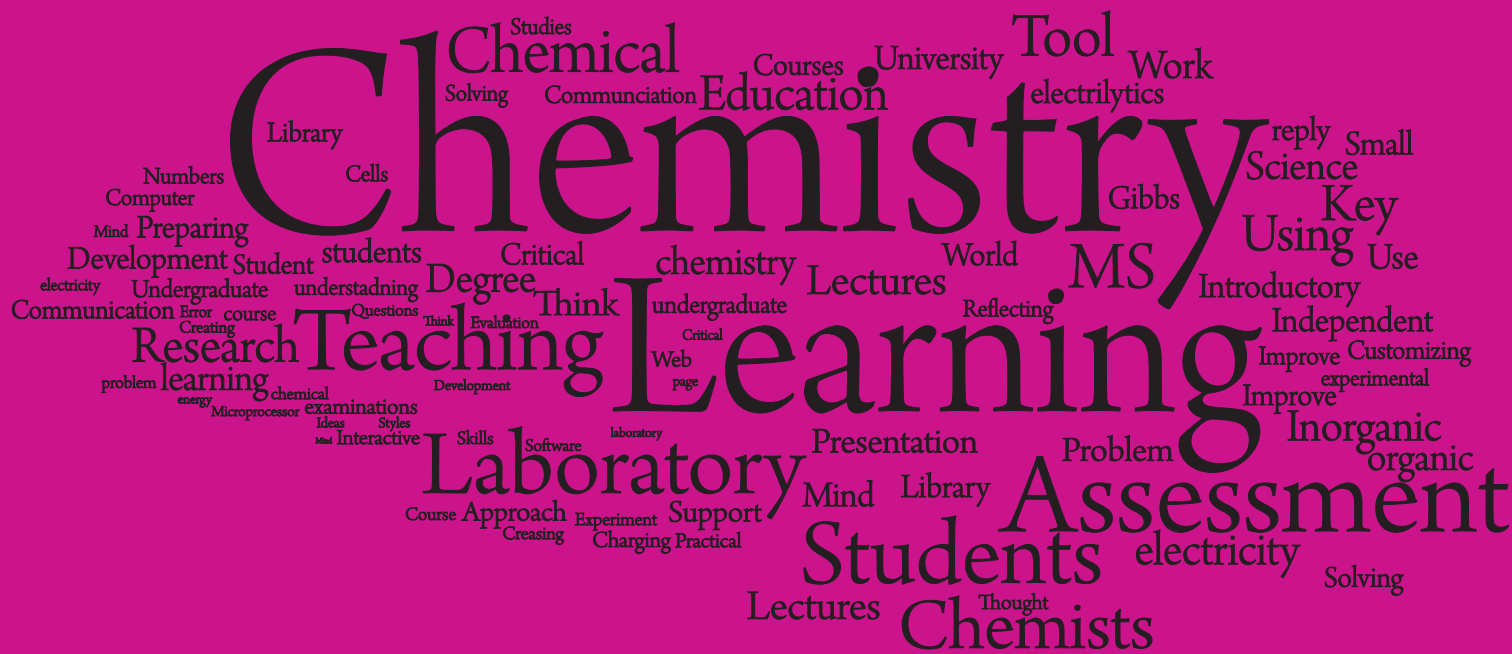

DEAR COLLEAGUE

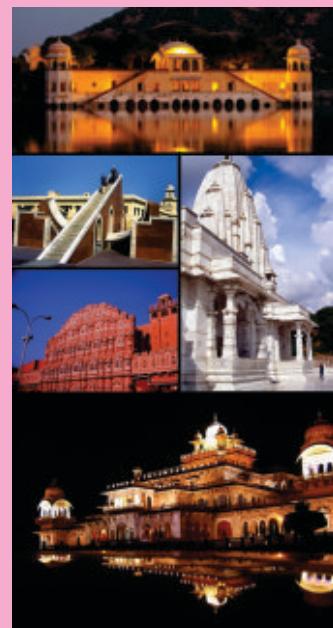

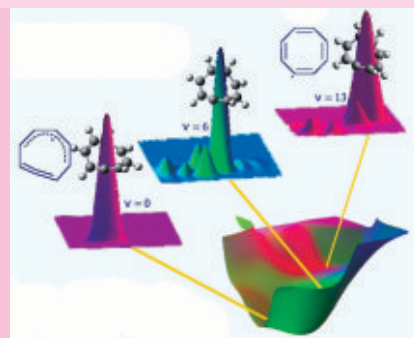


THE INSTITUTION

ASSOCIATION OF CHEMISTRY TEACHERS

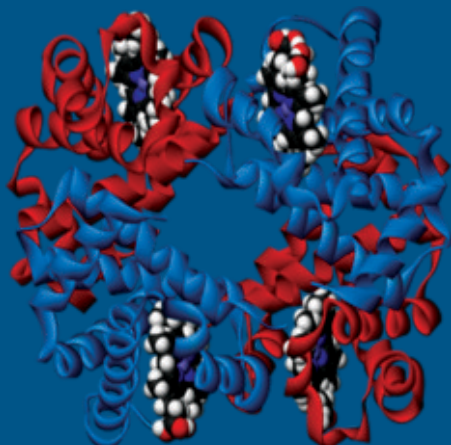

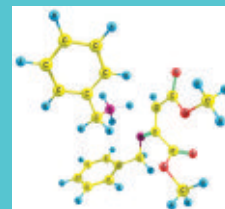

The abstract of not more than 250 words including:

- Title MS word in Arial (Size 16 points) in single spacing
- Affiliation MS word in Arial (Size 12 points)
- Authors MS word in Arial (Size 14 points)
- Abstract MS word in Arial (Size 12 points) in single spacing

Abstracts should briefly include the purpose of study, methods, results and conclusions. At the bottom of the page, please indicate the category (thrust area) and also whether an oral or poster presentation is preferred. (Only a few selected papers will be given the opportunity for oral presentation due to time constraint). The name of the presenting author should be underlined.

Abstract should be submitted through e-mail ncct2014@iisuniv.ac.in. One hard copy of the abstract must accompany the registration form along with the registration fee. The abstracts of only registered candidates will be considered for oral/poster presentation.

All the submitted abstracts will be scrutinized by a reviewing committee and notice of the acceptance will be sent by e-mail.

ORAL PRESENTATION

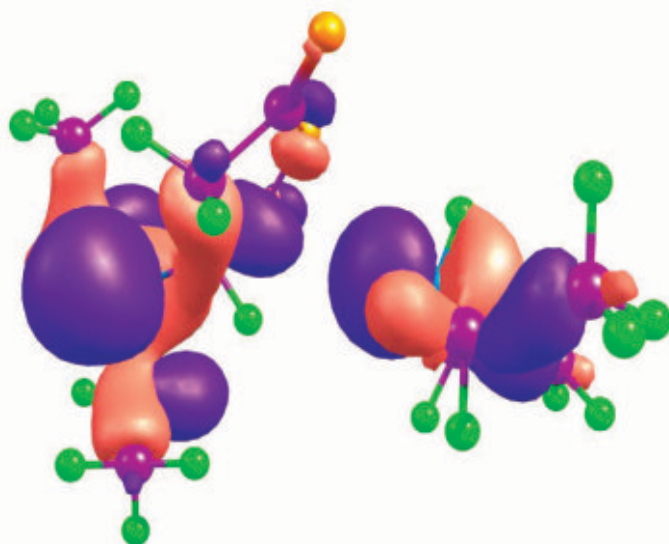
- For oral presentation, time of ten minutes will be given to each speaker.
